<u>Discretionary Learner Support Fund Application and</u> Self Declaration Combined Form v2



The Discretionary Learner Support Fund (DLSF) is available to help learners who are unable to access or complete learning due to financial difficulties. This help can cover tuition fees, exam fees, materials, travel and childcare. The level of support available varies based on the type of financial difficulties you have, the type of course you are studying and the funding available for the course you are enrolling on.

Once we have assessed your application, provided that you meet our criteria and we have funds available, we will be able to support you.

How we fund our courses

We are supported by the Department for Education (DfE) to enable us to deliver learning at a reduced cost to you.

For learners who meet the DfE's residency criteria* the DfE will support your learning in the following ways:

English, Maths, ICT, ESOL and Employability Courses - Adult Skills Fund (ASF) Funded Courses

For Maths, English and most Digital Skills courses the DfE will cover 100% of the cost of your learning, we call this full funding.

For all other courses (including ESOL) the DfE will cover the first 50% of the cost of your learning we call this co-funding. In addition to the above, where a learner is unemployed or earns less than £25750 per annum the DfE will fund the remaining 50% cost of the course.

To receive this support you must be able to evidence this with Payslips, Universal Credit statements or an employment contract/offer of employment including your full year salary**

Specialist provision Including Learning for all courses

In addition to basic skills training we offer life skill training for learners with SEND. These courses are funded through a separate Tailored learning pot. Courses are still funded by the DfE but are not eligible for full funding. Instead we are able to offer support to leaners in receipt of Personal Independence Payments (PIP), Disability Living Allowance (DLA) or Universal Credit. This support is in the form of 50% contribution towards the regular course fee up to a maximum value of £600 per learner per year.

Hardship funding

Additional help may be available to support our learners who are unable to access or complete learning due to financial difficulties. We can support you with the cost of course related materials, travel and childcare. The level of support available varies based on the type of financial difficulties you have, the type of course you are studying and the funding available for the course you are enrolling on. To allow us to help as many people as possible we limit support to any one individual to £275 per person per year***. Receipts/travel tickets will be required to claim support with the cost of travel. We will not usually cover costs associated with Private vehicles.
